Dr. Moridi gave a presentation on Building a Knowledge Based Economy to 40 engineers and invited guests.

Ryerson University Mentorship Program

his is the third academic year York Chapter volunteers worked with Ryerson's graduating class and my first as Program Director. This year we decided to focus our effort on the Civil Engineering Department, following our success of last year. Three mentors from York Chapter participated this time. In addition to providing mentors to a group of fourth year civil engineering students on their Capstone projects, we also offered guest lectures to the students on current practices in Civil Engineering. Our Past Chair Edward Poon, P.Eng., delivered a lecture on Request For Proposals (RFP) in October. Approximately 80 students and faculty members attended the lecture. It was well received by the audience. He will return to Ryerson in February and March to deliver two more lectures on Contract Administration and Construction Management. Our volunteers provide technical advice to the students and guide them to complete their Capstone Design project, which forms part of their graduation requirements. Around next April, all student groups will present their final design in front of their classes and the mentors. York Chapter mentors will participate as judges to the student presentation. Call for Nominations

The nominating committee of the York Chapter PEO is accepting nominations for the Chapter Directorate. The chapter executives are volunteer members who donate time and effort to participate in the operations and functions of the chapter. There is no direct monetary compensation, except for certain out-of-pocket expenses. The elected executives are required to attend monthly meetings, and participate in certain events/functions. Additional time commitments will vary depending upon the particular role/function of each position. Pertinent sections of the chapter by-laws Article 4 are:

- 1. The Directorate shall be not less than six (6) members and not more than twelve (12) members. A quorum shall be five (5).
- 2. A nominating committee comprised of one (1) member of the current directorate and two (2) members at large shall be appointed by the current executive. A notice shall be sent annually to all members requesting nominations for the directorate. The nominations must be received by the committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Nominations must bear the signature of two (2) nominators and the nominee. A nominee must be a member of the chapter.
- **3.** A slate of candidates including all those properly nominated shall be proposed by the nominating committee for presentation at AGM.
- **4.** The directorate shall be elected at the AGM from the proposed slate of candidates.
- **5.** The directorate will meet immediately after the AGM to elect the officers from its members.
