### Councillors' Corner

At the Chapter Leaders' Conference on April 28, 2006, Scarborough Chapter's Denis Carlos presented the Bridge Building Competition, and Ranee Mahalingam the EIT program. Councillors Jeff Mark and Seimer Tsang presented the Chapter Boundary Task Force update with proposed chapter boundaries based on postal codes. Paula Habas of PEO presented the PRISM update. Chapters can now use PRISM for emailing members, posting event calendars, and chapter newsletters.

n May 4, PEO submitted an advisory paper to Ontario Energy Minister Donna Cansfield proposing to undertake a joint Value Analysis project of Ontario's energy conservation challenge. PEO budgeted \$75,000 for this project.

At the recent Regional Councillors Committee (RCC), chapters were encouraged to enhance participation in the regulatory

- and licensing activities of PEO. Examples of new opportunities:
- 1. Government Liaison Program (GLP) at the chapter level
- 2. Class of Licensees at certificate presentation events
- 3. Regional Offices at the universities to represent PEO
- 4. Invigilators for the Professional Practice Exam (ethics and law exam)
- 5. Mentoring Engineers-in-Training, International engineering graduates
- 6. Reviewing Engineers-in-Training work reports
- 7. Academic/Experience Requirements Committee interviewing applicants
- 8. Discipline and Complaints and enforcement roles at the chapter level
- 9. Promoting and recruiting engineering students at universities.

The 2007 business plans have been submitted and will be reviewed by the regional councillors, so that the chapters' requirements can be included in the PEO budget process. Since the fees increase was not approved, funds may not be adequate to fulfil everyone's wishes.
